

# German WWII Marschstiefel (Tall Boots) Evaluation

The grading of the suppliers listed here is based solely on the personal judgment of Doug Strong. No insult is intended, nor does it reflect the opinions of any reenactment organization. The boots have been placed in three tiers. The list is made with US buyers in mind. All prices have been converted into US dollars at a March 2026 exchange rate. Recent changes to tariff laws will impact the actual prices paid by US buyers. This is not included in the prices presented here in most cases. This evaluation does not take into account makers that have changed their designs multiple times and only accounts for the newest version as pictured on their website. Some makers may also have old stock from earlier runs with which they are still filling orders. It may also be possible that companies have changed their designs and not changed the photos on their websites.

Tier 1 boots are usually made by the company, seller or individual selling them and are high in both quality and authenticity.

My recommendation is as follows.

1. Buy from a top-tier maker if at all possible. Their price is VERY similar to a tier two dealer and their quality and authenticity are far superior. My recommendation would be **Lederarsenal** above all if you have time to wait for custom boots. If you need boots quickly, then off the shelf boots from **At The Front** is the best choice.

3. If budget is the biggest concern then consider a tier two pair and have a skilled cobbler (such as myself or Chris Chase) fix them and make them wearable for you. I personally like the boots from **Hessen Antique** very much as they are easy to repair and maintain. I have recommended these boots for members of my family. I have also personally bought boots for my own use from **Chronicle Militaria** and **Crossley Co.**
